GENERAL COMMENTS	<u>CHIEF STEWARD'S COMMENTS</u> Following a post event review of the times recorded for both the 800m and 1600m events, the Chief Steward and Steward measured the circular track. The track was found to be 390m and not 400m. A further check of the track was undertaken	
	following the event which confirmed the track was short. SAAL administration has requested that at all future meets two officials must check all the track measurements before races commence irrespective of advice received on track length.	
	As a result of this error, the times for both the 800m and 1600m races have been removed from the SAAL database for handicap assessment. The VAL has been advised of the situation with regard to the races.	
	DECISION OF NON-PENALTY MEETING	
	The Henley Gift meeting has been declared by SAAL as a non-penalty meeting. The winners of each event will not be penalised with their current handicap marks.	
	70m Under 14 – Heat 4	
	 Gisele Grims who missed competing in Heat 2 was included in Heat 4 by the Chief Steward due to a scratching by the backmarker in red. 	
	70m Over 35 – Heats 1-3
