	Greg Whitecross	1st: 1600 Metre Over 35 Final – Athlete has been asked for an explanation for an improved performance beating 'Target Time' by 17 seconds in 4:23.04. He ran off the same mark (660m) at the Mort Daly Pre-Bay meet in 4:40.90. This is a substantial improvement of some 60.7m in 10 days. A unanimous decision was made amongst all four Stewards for a \$100 fine to be sanctioned.	Fine - \$100 of prizemoney
	Bennett Maxwell	1st: 1600 Metre Men – Chief Steward spoke to the Coach for an explanation of his improved performance and as a result breaking 'Target Time' by 4½ seconds in 4:05.35. He ran off the same mark (265m) at Port Adelaide (19/11) in 4:19.14. His next run was at the Mort Daly Meet (17/12) in two 1600m events. His first run in the 1600m Women & Over 35 Final was a 3 rd Place in 4:33.18 off 170m. After a 2.75 hour break Bennett chose to run the 1600m Men's event off 265m where he finished 12 th in a field of 14 in 4:43.15. This equates to approx. 38 seconds slower than his Bay Sheffield Carnival performance. At a race MPS of 5.44m/sec this is approx. a 200m improvement in 10 days. The Coach accepted the Chief Steward's analysis and was advised a 20% fine of prizemoney be sanctioned.	Fine – 20% of prizemoney

- The Stewarding Team recognises the significant improvement made by Ella Byrne and the time achieved which was well below target. It also notes that Ella has limited exposed form over the distance and that there was an appeal of the handicap on the basis that Ella would not break target time off her allocated mark.
- After consideration of this the Chief Steward has issued a NAP for her performance which requires the handicapper to review her marks across all distances.

CHIEF STEWARD'S COMMENTS

120m Men's Semi Final – Redraw

- After the conduct of the Heats and post initial allocation of the Semi Finals, the Chief Steward was approached by a Coach and asked to consider a redraw on the basis that three of his athletes were drawn in the same Semi. After consultation with the Chief Judge and the Assistant Steward, a decision was made to agree to this request.
- After the conduct of the Semi Finals, it became apparent to me that whilst
 the redraw was done in good faith and with good intent, the redraw
 advanced two athletes of the Coaches' Stable and disadvantaged another
 athlete (Corey Baker). In association with the League Executive we have
 determined that in future, system derived Semi Finals will <u>NOT</u> be changed
 under any circumstance.



Weather Interruption

As the Bureau of Meteorology forecasted thunderstorms and lightning activity for the metropolitan area in the late afternoon the Chief Steward monitored the weather conditions from 4pm with the view of running having to be suspended if necessary.

We were able to continue, until at 5.50pm the Chief Steward & Stewards agreed to suspend the meeting for 20 minutes due to lightning in the area and the running resumed at 6.15pm.
