Risk Management Policy

1. Introduction

The purpose of this document is to identify applicable risks and to enable risk management procedures to be satisfactorily identified, organised, and maintained.

The South Australian Athletic League will endeavor to minimise the risk any particular operation poses to our League, our staff, our volunteers, our officials, our members, or the general public.

2. Policy

SAAL aims to use its best practice in risk management to support and enhance our activities in all areas of our league. We will ensure risk management is an integral part of all our decision-making processes. SAAL will use a structured risk management program to minimise reasonably foreseeable disruption to events, harm to people and damage to the environment and property. We will identify and take advantage of opportunities as well as minimising adverse effects. SAAL will train our people to implement risk management effectively. We will strive to continually improve our risk management practices.

3. Definitions

“Risk” is the probability that an occasion will arise that presents a danger to League, our staff, our volunteers, our officials, our members, or the general public. It includes, but is not limited to;

- Physical & Mental hazards
- Financial hazards
- Reputational hazards
- Legal hazards
- Environmental hazards

4. Responsibilities

The SAAL Management committee are responsible for the implementation of the risk processes and ultimately responsible for the management of risks in the League. The Executive Officer is responsible for the development of and continual review of the SAAL risk management process for each Carnival/Event. All employees, officials and or volunteers are responsible for managing risks in their areas.
